→ Was any part of the message unclear? Which aspect of the message do you think will be the most challenging to apply to your own life?



- → Do you agree with the "big idea" of this passage? Why or why not?
- 1. Describe a time when you had certain expectations of someone or some company, and then they failed to meet those expectations? Did you conclude your expectations were unreasonable or realistic?
- 2. What unrealistic expectations do you think most married people have when they get married? What do you think typically happens when reality sets in?
- → What role do you think unrealistic expectations play in the failure of marriages that end in divorce?
- 3. Have you encountered people who had unrealistic expectations of you (work, friends, family, etc.)? How did that conflict get resolved?
- 4. What expectations have you had of God that you since learned were not realistic (biblically accurate)?
- 5. How does our view of God impact our experiences with doubt?

- 6. Do you think God wants to change our expectations of Him? If so, how and why?
- 7. After Acts 12, when Paul takes prominent leadership in the early church, why do you think we don't read more about Peter?
- 8. The Roman Catholic church teaches the Pope is infallible. If Peter was the first pope, as they claim how do these passages impact their teaching about Peter?

- 12. What is the significance of Peter referring to the following passages in 1 Peter 2:4-8?

- 13. Read Matthew 18:15-20. Do you see any parallels between this passage and Matthew 16:19?
- 14. Why do you think Jesus instructed the disciples not to reveal His Messianic identity in Matthew 16:20?
- 15. How does Peter's rebuke of Jesus reveal about his expectations of Jesus' mission?
- 16. If following Jesus is a constant spiritual battle, how do Jesus' words in Matthew 16:24-28 describe it?
- 17. If a young Christian asked you what Jesus meant by "take up your cross," what would you say?
- 18. Read Colossians 2:15, Psalm 68:11-18, then Ephesians 4:8, where Paul quotes Psalm 68:18. (Bashan is area where Matt. 16:13-23 takes place.) Of what significance is this to our understanding of Matt. 16:13-30?
- 19. When have you been disappointed with God? How have you dealt with that? How might this study help you?
